Dear **Ednor I, Ednor II, and Venable I** (Weinberg Court) Residents,

As you know, the water systems at Stadium Place have been treated to address the presence of Legionella, the bacterium that causes Legionnaire's disease. At this time, the water restrictions outlined in the December 29th letter to residents are **LIFTED**, and residents may begin normal use of the hot and cold water in their apartment. Until further notification, **RESIDENTS MAY:**

- ✓ Take Showers or baths with out restrictions.
- ✓ Wash dishes with out restrictions.
- ✓ Cook with the cold water without restrictions.
- ✓ Consume the cold water without restrictions.

It is important to remember to always get your drinking water and cooking water from the cold water side of the faucet.

If you experience symptoms of pneumonia, such as fever, cough, or shortness of breath, please contact your health care provider and inform him or her that you live in a location where some residents have been diagnosed with Legionnaire's Disease.
